Shift Landside affected People to a Safe Place

LALITPUR: The National Human Rights Commission has urged the government to shift the landslide affected people from Lumley, Bhadauretamagi and Dhikurpokhari of Kaski district to a safe place. The Commission has drawn the attention of the Government towards shifting of the human settlement following the death of 35 people as well as the missing of the people in those places due to the landslide leaving the place unsafe for human settlement.

The Commission also urges the government to immediately make relief and compensation available to the victims' families that suffered human casualties and the loss of properties and to make the arrangement of free treatment to the injured undergoing treatment at various hospitals in Pokhara. The Commission also urges the concerned authorities to manage the carcasses of dead animals in the area of incident to evade possible outbreak of epidemics.

The authorities need to identify the places which at risk of landslide and step up the preventive measures to evade further loss of the people and properties.

The Commission urges the Government of Nepal and concerned parties to make immediate arrangement of the safe human settlement to those living in the vulnerable places in Kaski including various districts of the country due to the continuous exploding of landslide.
