Long Term Program urged for the Conflict Affected Children

LALITPUR: The organizations working for the armed conflict affected children have urged the Government of Nepal (GoN) to properly identify the conflict affected children, collect their factual data and to bring long term program for their well-being.

Twelve organizations working in the field of child rights have mentioned this in the Memorandum presented to the NHRC Chairperson Justice Anup Raj Sharma.

'We demand the early implementation of the plan of action with regard to rehabilitation and integration of the armed conflict affected children which hasn't been implemented even after four years of its announcement of the GoN made way back on 29th December- 2010,' the Letter of Memorandum says.

Receiving the MoU at NHRC, Chairperson Sharma said that the Commission would advance in collaboration with the organizations working in the field of rights of child. Chairperson Sharma also affirmed the Commission will incorporate the issues relating the rights of child in the would-be formulated six year strategic plan of the Commission.

On the occasion, the participating armed conflict affected children threw light on both mental and social problems they had face and appealed to the Commission to extend support for acquiring the lost rights of theirs.

The delegation led by Anjana Shakya, President of Himalaya Manav Adhikarkarmi Samuha (Himrights) – Nepal presented the 10-point memorandum letter to the Commission.

The delegation consisted of 'Sundar Nepal', Human Rights Network and Peace Group – Nepal, 'Community Development Program – Nepal, NGO Federation of Nepal, 'Child Concern Center, Nepal, 'Village Reconstruction Organization, Nepal, Shreepura Community Development Center, 'Integrated Community Development Campaign, Nepal, Child Welfare Society, Nepal and Village Development center, Nepal.
