NHRC Urges the Proclamation of New Constitution, and Seriousness towards Communal Harmony, People's Human Rights and Human Sentiments

Supposedly, today is the last day for the constituent assembly (CA). The new constitution has to come today through the CA predestined to protect and institutionalize the achievements of historical People's Movement and Comprehensive Peace Accord (CPA). Or else, the changing circumstances will not only brew the constitutional crisis in the country but also will possibly push the country into yet another conflict. Likewise, this will not only invite the conflict between the ethnicities, religious communities, regional and linguistic groups also leave severe impact on the human rights and humane sentiments.

It is, therefore, irrefutably appropriate for now to build consensus on the issues concerning constitution making or otherwise to make the constitution internalizing the consensus reached through constitutional process on the unresolved issues so far.

The National Human Rights Commission, therefore, urges all the concerned parties to immediately impede to the disharmonious skirmish emerged between the cadres of the political forces and social groups, ethnic, linguistic, religious intolerance related slogans and demonstrations, speeches, statements that would likely to foster despise in parts of the country, but to move ahead with ethnic equality and harmony. The NHRC also appeals to the Nepal Government to maintain high degree of alertness with the arrangement of effective law and order in all parts of the country including the capital.

Likewise, the NHRC draws the attention of all the concerned parties to be serious towards human rights and humane sentiments while launching agitation for their rights and liberties.
